

TARANTO is in a baricentric position, in beetwen Suez and Gibraltar, with respect to the East and West Mediterranean routes of cruise ships. It is about 1000 nautical miles from Suez.







Taranto, the ancient cradle of Magna Graecia

Rich with monuments, theatres, temples and schools, made wealthy thanks to agricultural production and trade exchanges with the homeland, Taranto (then called Taras) was known as the capital of **Magna Graecia**.

«The pearl in the Ionian Sea», Taranto is a bridge between East and West.

The massive **Doric columns** are the remains of a temple facing the sea, dedicated either to a God or a Goddess - it is still uncertain whether it was Poseidon or Aphrodite.

As in many cities in the Magna Graecia, the great **Goddess Persephone** was worshipped also in Taranto. A great statue depicting the Goddess can be admired in the Archaeological Museum.









Sparta and Taranto, mother and daughter

Taranto was founded in 706 BC by a young Spartan warrior named FALANTO, the only colony far from the homeland. Before leaving, Falanto was told the following words by the Delphi Oracle: "When you see rain from the clear sky, you will overtake territory and city." During the voyage, his ship was wrecked. Falanto was rescued by a dolphin, hence the symbol of the city, and led to shore. Falanto, exhausted, fell asleep on the knees of his wife Etra, who started crying. Falanto, whose face was wet with the tears of Etra (clear sky), understood the sense of that prophecy that until then seemed like an puzzling enigma. Thus, after having landed on the East coast at Saturo, the Spartans moved westward to found the ancient TARAS.

Staying fit and active is a pleasure and you can choose whichever activity suits you best: from **swimming** in the azure waters of the beaches, to exploring the Gulf of Taranto and its wonderful underworld of cetaceans, snorkeling or **surfing** the waves: it will be an unforgettable experience for the entire family. The journey becomes even more adventurous while **biking** across the vineyards and the country roads of the Valle d'Itria, **free-climbing** the cliffs of the gravine or **trekking** in the WWF Oasis La Vela.











CANOEING and SNORKELING



Canoeina, in balance between land, water and sky and guided by experienced volunteers, you can enjoy the landscape of the Mar Piccolo from the same point of view of the animals that inhabit it.

Discover the sealife in Mar Piccolo with snorkeling: its waters are home to the biggest colony of seahorses in the Mediterranean.

The biologists will lead you on a dolphin watching "ecotour" with noiseless motorboats to have an up-close meeting with the dolphins and learn about their life. Sighting chances are more then 90%. If you are really lucky you may have the chance to stumble upon sperm whalest

RELAXING AT THE BEACH

Puglia boasts a 540 miles (860 km) long sun-kissed coastline with golden beaches and crystal clear waters.

Many beaches along the Jonian coast near Taranto carry the Blue Flag and "Sails" certification, awarded by Legambiente and the Touring Club of Italy to the country's most gorgeous beaches.



FREE **CLIMBING - HIKING**

The beautiful ravine of the Jonian Area are a natural paradise.

The ravines are real canyons, more than 60, surrounding Taranto in the area including the towns of Statte, Castellaneta, Palagiano, Laterza, etc (approx. 20 km and more from Taranto). The heights span from 100-300 to 300-500 meters above sea level; the cliff faces are rather narrow and deep descending to 200 meters.

In this wild paradise, the birthplace of the 11thcentury Apennine civilization, there are churches and many dwellings dug into the rock and tufa stone, some of which have yet to be explored. ZIPLINING AND SUSPENSION BRIDGE



The ANGEL'S FLIGHT is a zip-line suspended between the tops of two small towns, Castelmezzano and Pietrapertosa. Tied in total safety with a harness, attached to the steel cable, you will live the thrill of flying for a few minutes above the beautiful landscape of the Lucanian Dolomites about 1000 metres above the around at a speed of 100 km/h.

The MOON BRIDGE is an exciting 300 meters walk on a suspension bridge at the height of 120 meters above the around near the picturesque ruins of a Middle Ages Castle.



BIKING OTO

Explore the most beautiful places in the areas around Taranto surrounded by nature and history, stone-built masserie (ancient farmhouses), olive groves and vineyards.











Spartan Race

Taranto has hosted in 2016 the famous "Spartan Race", a competition inspired by the tough physical exercise that Spartans had to endure in order to train themselves for war.

The participants share the belief in discipline and most of all in mutual support, as many of them help each other getting up if they fall during the race, or if they have any difficulty.

This way sport lovers from all over the world find their homeland in Taranto, the **Daughter of Sparta**.









Grottaglie European City of Sport 2020

With the objective to educate its citizens and especially young people to the values of community, sharing and health, the town of Grottaglie crafted a program of activities and investments which led to its candidacy and winning of the title of European City of Sport for year 2020. Next year the town will be the location of both regional and national paralympic sports tournaments, and furthermore will start up the construction of new facilities, among which the Citadel for Paralympic sports and bike sharing spots in town. Grottaglie is already carrying out an intense activity of promotion of sports among its citizens regardless of age, sex, and physical ability, involving swimming, soccer, trekking, run, volley, and all the sports practiced by its 40 associations.









Ikkos – The Athlete from Taranto

At the dawn of human history, the ancient Greeks put at the core of their civilization physical activity, which was the greatest expression of strength, loyalty, respect: values which are celebrated in sports even today. According to some, one of the greatest athletes of his time was born in Taranto: **IKKOS**.

The skeleton found in Taranto and exhibited at the **National Archaeological Museum** is known as "the athlete from Taranto", winner of the Panathenaic games.



DID YOU KNOW

Today the legacy of IKKOS is still alive and represented by the athletes that have received the medal of the **ORDER OF IKKOS**, which symbolizes that coaching, hard work and respect are fundamental in sports.











Rodolfo Valentino

It is not an exaggeration to use the term "legend" when referring to Rodolfo Valentino. The silent film era star was born in 1895 in **Castellaneta**, a town about half an hour's drive from Taranto, and became famous in America thanks to his charming looks, becoming known as Latin Lover.



DID YOU KNOW

During his trips to Italy Valentino met the most famous poets of the time, among which D'Annunzio. The actor used to write his own poems, such as the following:

Italy
The earth is earth - that is its worth,
To men who walk below.
But to the soul that seeks its goal,
Each land is all they know.
One calls it Home, another Heart,
another Property,
But to the one who loves the sun

He calls it Italy."


















MARVEL AT HISTORY AND CULTURE

You will feel like travelling in time while walking around the Ionian city, from its Spartan origins 3000 years ago, to the Renaissance. Just a hour's drive from Taranto, discover one of the most ancient cities in the world, Matera.

Discover how artisans still craft beautifully decorated **vases**, dishes and lamps in Grottaglie. This century old art is still alive in the village where a handful of workshops are open to visitors and display colorful creations.

There's plenty of fish in the sea, especially in Taranto! Well not fish but actually mammals. Go on **boat tours** to spot **dolphins** in the gulf of Taranto. For **trekking** lovers, the gravine (ravines) of the valley of Itria are the place to go.

The Old City of **Taranto**

Taranto is known as the CITY OF TWO **SEAS**, as its Old Town lies on an island at the meeting point between two seas (the open sea, Mar Grande, and a wide bay with two inlets, Mar Piccolo).

This strategic location has put it at the heart of important historical events.

DID YOU KNOW

The Old City is characterized by narrow alleys and streets. The city was planned on purpose with the aim to protect the inhabitants from attackers: in fact it is difficult for two people to walk along the streets of the Old City side by side. One of these streets is known as "Vicolo del Bacio" (Kiss Alley), as it is impossible for people who cross this road not to brush against each other.













The Aragonese Castle

Overlooking the Ionian sea, Taranto's famous Renaissance ancient fortress, the **Aragonese Castle**, was built in the 15th century by the King of Naples Ferdinand of Aragona.

Today, there are guided tours of the Castle every day and also many events and exhibitions going on throughout the year.



DID YOU KNOW

The Castle was chosen as a location for Michael Bay's new film "Six Underground" with Ryan Reynolds and Melanie Laurent. The scenes were shot on the "Kismet", the famous 95 m long mega yacht which berthed at the Castle for a few days.











MarTA

As the ancient capital of Magna Graecia, Taranto houses one of the most important archaeological museums, the National Archaeological Museum of Taranto, also called the MarTA, boasting one of Italy's most important archeological collections.

The main attraction of the museum is the impressive collection of ancient gold jewellery in all of Italy.

An incredible display of beautiful bracelets, elegant earrings and precious artifacts shows the evolution of the **"gold-work"** in the city between the 4th and 3rd centuries BC.



DID YOU KNOW

The Ministry of National Heritage and Culture financed the videogame app **Past For Future**, about the mysterious disappearance of a woman in Taranto that a boy of London will investigate discovering the trasures in the National Archaeological Museum.















MUDI - Diocesan Museum

Considered one of the largest museum complexes in Italy, the **Mudi (Diocesan Museum)** is set up in the former Archiepiscopal seminary of Taranto in the heart of the historic centre, just a stone's throw from the Cathedral.

The museum displays more than **300 artworks** which walk the visitor through the ecclesiastical and religious history of the province from the 7th to the 20th century, through sacred furniture, relics, sculptures and paintings of exceptional cultural value, such as the "Assumption of the Virgin Mary" attributed to Domenico Carella, or the precious "Ecce Homo" by Paolo De Matteis.



DID YOU KNOW

The biggest topaz in the world (more than 1.5 Kg) is exhibited at the MuDi.









Matera European Capital of Culture 2019

About an hour's drive away from Taranto lies the ancient Cave city of Matera. You will feel like travelling in time while visiting this city, one of the oldest human settlements in the world, having been populated since 10.000 B,C.

Declared a UNESCO World Heritage in 1993, today Matera is the European Cultural Capital for the year 2019



DID YOU KNOW


The Sassi were made world-famous in 2005 when Mel Gibson's movie "The Passion" was shot there.











Messapic Walls Archaeological Park

The wonderful Mura Messapiche (Messapic City Walls) Archaeological Park of Manduria, which covers about 150,000 square metres, is surrounded by two circles of walls and it is one of the largest and important sites in Italy.

Outside the megalithic walls, with three circles of walls built to face the expansion of Taranto, there is the wonderful necropolis with more than 2,000 messapic tombs dating back to the 6th - 2nd century BC.











SAVOUR FOODMINE









Fishing tourism

During the excursion a stop is made to enjoy a swim in the clear waters of the Cheradi Islands, an ideal area for fishing, and finally there is a moment dedicated to cooking the fresh catch and tasting the flavors of the Taranto cuisine.

Octopuses, squilla mantises, caramote prawns, sargos, congers, gilt head breams are hauled onboard as our fishermen do everyday and are cooked on the spot for your lunch on the fisher boat.









Olive oil and wine tastings

The characteristic feature of Apulian landscape are vineyards and thousand-years-old olive groves.

Today these products are one of Puglia's world known outstanding features. Passengers can tour the cantine (wineries) and sample the best wine grape varities, among which are Negramaro, Primitivo, or Verdeca (and many more).

In the frantoi (olive mills) the process involved in producing the oil will be explained and of course there will be an invitation to savour the produce, even with typical bread and cheese.









100 Farmhouses and the Green Road

The ancient fortified farmhouses in the province of Taranto, the so called **masserie**, are being turned into hotels and restaurants, where courses of traditional Apulian cuisine are held for both international and national quests.

In a charming whitewashed setting, where stone walls preserve ancient history, guests can take part in experience based tours: local chefs are pleased to reveal the secrets of preparing orecchiette (traditional ear shaped pasta), mozzarella (a kind of soft cheese) and Apulian bread during select workshops.





DISCOVER TRADITIONS









Taranto: The Procession of the Holy Mysteries

Taranto, whose traditions are held dear, has always been famous for its religious events. For centuries on every Friday the city has been participating in the Holy **Procession of the Mysteries**. Figures dressed in the typical dress of the "perdone", white sash with a white hood and only two holes for the eyes, walk slowly along the funeral music, played by the band for the death of Christ.

For spectators it's a beautiful event, for the devotees it is the most sublime divine manifestation.









The pottery of Grottaglie

Tucked away in Puglia, the heel of the boot, Grottaglie is a small gem and a new shorex destination from Taranto. Guests will be charmed and artistically involved in this village with earthenware laden roofs and pottery workshops, as Grottaglie boasts an ancient tradition of ceramic art.

During the tour an expert artisan will guide visitors in the creative process of making a vase with a treadle wheel.











The Itria valley

The Valley, an extensive karst depression, includes the beautiful towns of Alberobello, Locorotondo, Martina Franca, Ceglie Messapica, Cisternino and Fasano, the so called "borghi" that is characteristic small villages with preserved historic centre.

The Valley is dotted with thousands of trulli, small limestone dwellings with cone shaped roofs, held together without mortar.




The animated series for kids Trulli Tales takes place among the trulli. Its copyright was acquired by Disney which will broadcast the series in Europe, Africa and the Middle East.

Falanto Port Service Center

The Port Network Authority's objective is to provide Taranto with a new **seaculture**, encouraging the union of the port, the city and the environment into a single experience.

The Port Network Authority has planned the construction of a Multipurpose Service Center on the Molo S. Cataldo as well as the renovation of the pier's East side berthing quay.

The works foresee the realization of a multipurpose building dedicated to the following activities:

Promotion of maritime culture: multi purpose auditorium, meeting rooms, areas for exhibitions and educational activities; Passenger services; "meet and greet" services (information point, lounge area, bar, restrooms).

Works will be completed for cruise season 2020/2021.











New Waterfront

The requalification of S. Cataldo Pier as waterfront is carried out with the aim to reintegrate the city of Taranto with the port.

The structure between the seaside and the buildings is a medium of passage between two systems.

The path ends at the port gateway tower, which represents a landmark in the urban landscape.

The various technological possibilities allow this solution to be versatile.





New Waterfront

The exhibition and narrative path will involve a few areas of the Falanto Port Service Center, the uncovered areas of the existing buildings, the paths at different levels and the wall in the Observatory Tower.

The exhibiton path starts in the Falanto, where dedicated areas will narrate the sea culture and the history of the city as well as its relationship with the port and the Mediterranean Sea.

The narrative path continues in the area between buildings interpreted as crooms» of an open exhibition, integrated with the surrounding environment.











Swan Project

The SWAN project (Sustainable Water Aerodrome Network) is part of the EU2014/2020 cooperation program between Greece and Italy with the aim to connect Gallipoli, Nardò and Taranto with the Greek Islands. The participants are the Corfu port authority, the Corfu Municipality, the Port Network Authority of the Ionian Sea, the Gallipoli and Nardo Municipalities, with the support of the Italian Maritime Aviation and Master project foresees Ludi. The of infrastructure construction seaplanes in the ports of Taranto, Gallipoli and Santa Maria al Bagno in Italy and in Corfu, Paxos, Erikusa, Matraki and Othoni in Greece. These facilities will be dedicated to civil protection, environmental monitoring, rescue and assistance and to develop seaplane tourism with connections between Puglia and Greece.








The airports of Bari and Brindisi are located at 90 km and 75 km respectively from the Port of Taranto, providing daily flights to and from key centres in Italy and Europe.

The Apulia airport network represents then, for location and infrastructures, one of the most interesting European Italian realities. Its favorable position in the middle of a strategic area like the Mediterranean, makes it an essential asset inside continental transport networks.











The airport of **Grottaglie**, where the aircraft manufacturing company LEONARDO - on behalf of Boeing - operates, is about 20 km from Taranto and is connected to the seaport by a road that runs directly from the port's Northern Gate.

Grottaglie has a 3.2 km runway, thus offering scope for an additional mode of transport for **passengers** and goods handled at the Port of Taranto.

Passengers are welcomed by English speaking personnel of this Authority as well as students, who provide information on the city.
